- 0656 Chí Hwán-gũng and allies make intrusion into Chù
- 0632 **Jìn** Wýn-gũng and allies defeat Chủ force in Wèi
- 0517 Exile of Lů Jāu-gūng (to a town on the Chí border)
- 0509 Lů Dìng-gūng succeeds; reigns from Lǔ capital
- 0479 Last year of Chūn/Chyōu. Confucius dies; sayings recorded in LY 4
- 0436 Dzvngdž dies; his son Dzvng Ywán succeeds as head of Analects school
- 0400 Kung family (Dž-sz) assumes leadership of Analects school; ritual focus
- 0390 Dzwo Jwan begun in Lu. First Mician writing (MZ 17, against war)
- 0376 Hán extinguishes Jvng and moves its capital to Jvng
- 0365 Ngwèi moves its capital to Dà-lyáng
- 0360 Earliest Chí statecraft writings (GZ 1-3, 7)
- 0350 DDJ begun in Lů (mystical DDJ 14)
- 0343 Chí defeats Ngwèi at Battle of Mǎ-líng, in Ngwèi
- 0342 **Chí** ruler assumes title of King (Wáng \pm)
- 0336 Lǎu Dān succeeds as leader of DDJ meditation school (DDJ 22, 10)
- 0327 Alexander completes conquest and Hellenization of Bactria
- 0322 First Chinese echo of a Greek literary motif (Upright Gung, LY 13:18)
- 0320 Shr repertoire is closed. Mencius sees Ngwèi [Lyáng] Hwèi-wáng
- 0316 Mencius achieves ministership in Chí
- 0315 Yēn ruler abdicates to his minister; civil chaos ensues. Chí invades Yēn
- 0314 Chí annexes pacified Yēn; Jàu and allies expel Chí and restore Yēn King
- 0313 Mencius departs; Chí King founds Jì-syà political theory establishment
- 0312 Dzwo Jwan completed and presented to the Chí King
- 0286 Chí exterminates Sùng. Làu Dān dies (his last chapter is DDJ 66)
- 0285 Allies expel Chí from Sùng; Chí King dies in remote town
- 0284 Third DDJ master Lǐ Jù writes his first chapter (DDJ 67, against war)
- 0282 Earliest of the Jwangdž writings (the primitivist JZ 8-10)
- 0278 Chín conquers Chủ capital; Chủ moves its capital eastward
- 0258 Sywndž goes to Chí as the senior member of the revived Jì-syà
- 0255 Chǔ invades Lù and conquers half of it.
- 0254 Sywndž becomes governor of Chu-occupied Lu
- 0249 Chǔ completes conquest of Lǔ; Chín extinguishes eastern Jōu remnant
- 0230 **Chín** extinguishes Hàn (0228 Jàu, 0225 Ngwèi, 0224 Chủ, 0222 Yēn)
- 0221 Chín conquers Chí, the last remaining Warring State. Chín Empire
- 0213 Lǐ Sz memorial against Confucian writings accepted
- 0210 Chín First Emperor dies
- 0209 Chín quickly collapses under Second Emperor; rebellions break out
- 0206 Nominal beginning of Hàn
- 0140 Accession of Han Wu-di; end of Warring States theory debates
